place of pilgrimage, and his great ambition and steadfast resolution was to erect a shrine for our Lady in South Africa. While up in Zambesia he never got courting disaster to try and spread the light of the Gospel. Material progress, civilisation, the opening up of distant counties by steam locomotion is, no doubt, important; but where men are harzing everything for merly worldly advantages, it were surley unbecomming of the Catholic Church not follow, at least if they cannot lead the way. I would fain hope that our readers will try and help us to give actuality to the little of this article and enable us to move Northward, Ho!
